This event will be run under SAEF and ESA Eventing Rules as at 1 June 2010, updated 1 March 2015 and FEI Eventing rules as at 8 January 2015

However we have approval from Eventing SA to run under the OLD Officials rules, but all the other new rules apply. It is the riders responsibility to familiarize yourself with these new rules. These rules are available on the Eventing SA (www.eventingsa.co.za) and WP Eventing Websites (www.wpeventing.co.za)

The cross country course is out of bounds to all competitors and horses as of the 13th May 2015.

- 1. We regret that no horse may enter the show without a horse flu vaccination and AHS, please complete details on entry form.
- 2. NO entries will be accepted without payment.
- 3. NO refunds will be made in respect of cancellations and scratching after closing date of entries.
- 4. Please Note the Organizing Committee reserves the right to combine, vary, divide or cancel classes if insufficient entries are received.
- 5. Insofar as possible the program and conditions relating thereto will be adhered to. However the Technical Delegate reserves the right to make alterations in the event of unfavourable weather conditions or any other unforeseen circumstances and should the show be cancelled or postponed for any reason, please refer to Rule 41.4.0 Cancellation Fee.
- 6. SAEF & ESA nor the GRC, the organizers and any officials appointed by these shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, injury sustained by owners, competitors, members of the public or any other person or persons or their property at the George Riding Club for the duration of the show.
- 7. All Classes will run according to current ESA rules. All relevant rules apply.(Website: www.eventingsa.co.za)
- 8. Horses and Ponies must be 5 years (4 years for .80cm Classes & below) and over.
- 9. By entering a stallion at the GRC, the competitor & owner agree to the following conditions & agree to abide by the following protocol:
 - Competition stallions remain the responsibility of the owner & rider at all times & they are expected to have public liability against any loss, injury or damage that might be caused by the stallion.
 - It is the responsibility of the owner & rider to ensure that the stallion cannot exit the stable allocated to it on its own/or with the help of another horse or uninformed person.
 - The stallion may only be removed from the stable during the show for exercise & preparation/competition & only in the presence of a responsible handler or rider.
 - Under NO circumstances shall the covering of mares be allowed to take place at the GRC premises.
 - Stallions are to wear a YELLOW RIBBON at all times either bridle or halter.
- 10. Surcingles and breastplates are strongly recommended for the X- country phase.
- 11. Approved correct Dressage and Show jumping dress and hats are essential. Gloves are compulsory for dressage
- 12. Skull caps, body protectors and medical aid cards are COMPULSORY at all levels, as per Eventing rule 45.4.2 for X- country phase.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The FederationEquestreInternationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of

aids.

- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia an

retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
