GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Applicable Rules

The event will be conducted under the respective Discipline rules and Regulations.

2. Membership

All owners, riders & ponies must be registered with the relevant participating bodies or an FEI Group IX National Federation as at closing date of entries. All ponies must be in possession of a Valid Passport.

N.B. ALL PASSPORTS MUST BE HANDED INTO THE EQUESTRIAN OFFICE ON ARRIVAL EXCEPT THOSE
THAT SHOULD BE PRESENTED WITH THE PONY AT THE HORSE INSPECTIONS. DO NOT FORGET.

3. Entries

Entries close on Monday 8 June 2015 and will be accepted only if they have been RECEIVED by the Show Secretary and are FULLY PAID FOR. Entry fees and stabling, are not refundable except when entries are withdrawn prior to the closing date of entries or where specifically stated in the schedule.

4. **Entry Fees** Entry fees are as clearly stated under Sections 1 - 6.

5. Qualifying Age

Competitors' qualifying age must be in accordance with the relevant participating bodies rules and regulations.

6. Dress

See Rules for the various participating Bodies. No Provincial or registered sponsor shirts may be worn while competing.

7. Treatment of Ponies & Conduct of Riders

The Discipline General Regulations together with the FEI Veterinary Regulations will be strictly applied. Ponies and/or Riders may be tested for the presence of prohibited substances.

8. Equine Influenza and African Horse Sickness

All ponies must have been vaccinated against Equine influenza according to the FEI Veterinary Regulations. Vaccinations are valid for six month and must be renewed prior to expiry; otherwise primary and secondary vaccinations will have to be re-administered. All ponies travelling to the AHS surveillance area/Free zone must apply according to the SOP for entering into the Controlled area prior to the commencement of the return journey A Permit must be issued by the State Veterinarian and be accompanied by a valid health certificate (in the passport) signed by a Private Veterinarian, not more than 48 hours prior to travelling. All ponies must have been vaccinated by a VETERINARIAN against African Horse Sickness using a registered polyvalent African Horse Sickness vaccine as prescribed by the manufacturer and in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations.

All ponies must be in possession of and be accompanied by a Valid passport, number to be included on the entry form. Details of all vaccinations must be entered in the passport. ALL PASSPORTS ARE TO BE HANDED IN TO THE EQUESTRIAN OFFICE ON ARRIVAL, EXCEPT THOSE THAT HAVE TO ACCOMPANY THE PONIES TO THE HORSE INSPECTIONS. Competitors not complying with the above will be fined and may be refused entry onto the grounds. No entries will be accepted without the relevant AHS and Flu vac details. No flu vaccination may be administered within 7 days of arriving at the show grounds.

9. Substitutions:

Application for substitutions must be made on the form provided at the secretary's office not later than 30 minutes before the commencement of the competition concerned or as per the discipline rules. The new rider must sign the substitution forms, indicating that he has the consent of the competitor originally entered.

10. Horse Inspection:

All ponies must be presented in a simple double bridle or snaffle with their show number on their bridles. <u>Showing</u> – All Provincial Open Team ponies and Open Ponies at 15h30 on Friday 26th June 2015 <u>Eventing</u> – All EV90cm Ponies at 16h00 on Friday 26th June 2015.

<u>Show Jumping</u> – All Open Individual Jumping & Provincial Open Team Ponies at 10h00 on Monday 29 June 2015

<u>Equitation</u> – All Open Individual and Provincial Team Ponies at 10h00 on Tuesday 30th June 2015 <u>Dressage</u> – All Medium, Elementary/Medium & Elementary Ponies and Provincial Team Ponies at 10h30 on Tuesday 30th June 2015

All ponies must be accompanied by their Horse Passports. The Height Certificate in the passport must be completed and signed in accordance with the relevant participating bodies' rules and regulations.

11. <u>Prize Money</u>: Prize money will be distributed at one for every four entries. <u>Please make sure that you fill in your banking details on the entry form as prize money will be paid via EFT</u>. Any personal information will be strictly confidential and not made available to any third party questrian Federation

earth floor and shavings @ R125 per night/day. Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase. The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Committee and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Stable Manager. Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the pony concerned. Preference will first be given to Out of Province ponies and Provincial Team Ponies and then to local ponies from outlying areas.

Stables will be allocated on a first come first paid basis. Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their entry form, however please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has entered early and you have entered late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first entered basis. NO temporary paddocks etc. may be erected anywhere on the show grounds. The grooms are encouraged to hand walk ponies. Please Note Owners of Stallions must indicate as such on the Entry Form. No fires may be lit in the Show grounds except in those areas designated by the Committee. Any person infringing this regulation will be held responsible for any damage that may arise. In the case of employees, their employers will be held responsible.

12. Stabling: R500 for the duration of the show or R150.00 per night or Scaffold Stables in HALL with

13. Feed & Bedding:

Initial wood shavings bedding will be supplied, thereafter bedding can be purchased via the Show office. Food can be ordered from feed companies. A List will be up on the Website. Allison's Tack & Feed Shop is in Victoria Road close to the Show Grounds and will have a stand at the Show next to the Medics.

14. Grooms Facilities:

There will be very limited grooms' accommodation/Tack Room available. This will be allocated per Province and Discipline. Once again it will be on a first entered & paid basis. Alternatively Competitors are advised to provide their groom with suitable accommodation in their Horse Boxes. Ablution facilities, with hot water, will be provided. Grooms food can be ordered from the Show Caterers from Friday 26 June to Sunday 5 July. No tents are allowed to be erected in the stable block perimeter. If there is a demand for it we will allocate an area for Groom's Tents.

15. Cancellation and combining of classes:

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, the organising committee reserves (in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury) the right to cancel or combine classes and restrict entries (other than those applicable to championships and their qualifying classes) to a practical number. Entry fees will be refunded for any entries not accepted.

16. Variation of Programme:

The programme will be adhered to as far as possible. The organising committee reserves the right (in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury) to make alterations in the event of insufficient or excessive entries, unfavourable weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

17. Obligations:

- 1. All Riders are obliged to ride in all competitions for which they have qualified, unless they have been granted dispensation by the President of the Ground Jury. This will normally only be given where a medical or veterinary certificate certifying that the rider or horse is unfit to compete, is produced prior to the competition concerned.
- 2. All riders and ponies are required to appear in parades when requested to do so.
- 3. Prize winners must be mounted when receiving their awards and both horse and rider must be properly dressed and turned out. Unless stated otherwise in the programme.

- 4. No blankets may be worn in the arenas unless permission is given by the Show Director.
- 5. Failure to co-operate and comply with these obligations may result in the forfeiting of all prize money, rosettes, trophies and/or grading points for that particular competition, unless permission is given by the Show Director.

18. Bridle Numbers:

Each pony will be allocated a number to be used throughout the event. This number must be attached to the LEFT-HAND SIDE of the halter/headcollar and also the bridle or numnah. A number will be randomly allocated to each horse. Bridal numbers for all horses competing at the event must be worn at all times for all disciplines.

19. Exercising of ponies:

At no time during the event may horses be exercised in the competition arenas. Only designated warm up arenas may be used.

No Pony may be exercised by any person other than a Pony Rider from Friday 26^{th} June – Sunday 5^{th} July 2015.

20. Responsibility for damage, loss or injury:

The participating Bodies, The Royal Riding Club, the Royal Agricultural Society, the Sponsors, the Organizers and any Officials appointed by these bodies, shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury sustained by owners, competitors, members of the Public or any other person or persons or their property at the R.A.S. Show Grounds for the duration of the show; and during the Cross Country at DOLCOED Equestrian Centre; or travel provided by the Royal Riding Club between RAS & DOLCOED Equestrian Centre.

21. Dogs:

All dogs must be kept on leads at all times on the show grounds.

22<u>. Services</u>: There will be a List of Farriers and Vets on Duty with Contact numbers at the Equestrian Office and the Stables; also on our Website <u>www.theroyalridingclub.co.za</u>.

23. Hotels and accommodation

24. Entertainment:

A list of proposed entertainment will be available on our website. There will be a Welcome Cocktail Party on Tuesday 30 June 2015 @ 18h30, & Mr & Miss SA Champs on Wednesday 1 July 18h30. **NO CHARGE**.

25. Grooms' Interprovincial Soccer Match:

26. Team Entries:

Notice by Provincial Bodies or FEI Group IX National Federations of their intention to participate in Team Championships must be sent to the Show Secretary, by no later than Thursday 5 June 2015.

Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the Show Secretary by 19th June 2015. The composition of nominated teams is laid down in General regulations and the final selected team in General Regulations. Each Provincial Body or National Federation may only enter one team. Team Managers must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 17h00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned.

The rules governing the substitution of team horses and/or riders is laid down in the Discipline General Regulations Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete in the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team. This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Provincial Body.

27. PROTESTS:

- 1. Protests may be lodged against any person or body involved in any capacity in the event subject to the jurisdiction of the Participating Bodies for failure to observe the Constitution, applicable Regulations or Rules or violation of the common principles of behaviour, fairness, or accepted standards of sportsmanship, whether occurring during and/or in connection with the event.
- 2. Any alleged contravention of the Rules relating to Prohibited Substances (Ponies and competitors) whether it occurs at a CI or CN Event or any other Event or at any other time shall be referred to the Judicial Committee for hearing, notwithstanding any Disciplines Rules and/or Regulations.
- 3. Protests may only be lodged by the Officials, Chefs d'Equipe or, if a Chef d'Equipe is not present, by a Person Responsible or a Team Veterinarian responsible for ponies taking part in the event, with the exception of protests for abuse which may be lodged by any person or body.
- 4. Protests must be in writing, on the prescribed official forms, signed by the authorised person making the protest, and presented Personally to the President of the Ground jury, as the case may be, together with any supporting evidence, names of witnesses and the necessary deposit, during the duration of the Event and accompanied by the deposit as set out in the Discipline General Regulations
- 5. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, protests against any of the following matters may only be lodged with the Ground Jury and within the following time limits, and a decision by the Ground Jury in these matters is a prerequisite to a right of appeal to the Appeal Committee.
- 5.1 Protests concerning the eligibility of a competitor or horse or to the conditions of the arena: not later than 30 minutes before the start of the relevant competition;
- 5.2 Protests concerning an obstacle, or the plan or length of the course for a jumping competition or the obstacle phase of a driving competition: not later than 15 minutes before the start of the competition;
- 5.3 Protests concerning the steeplechase or cross-country obstacles or courses in Eventing or marathon course or obstacle s in driving, or the course in Endurance not later than 18h00 on the day before the relevant competition;
- 5.4 Protests concerning irregularities or incidents during a competition, or the classification of a competition: not later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the results.

28. APPEALS

- 1. An Appeal may be lodged by any person with a legitimate interest against the decision(s) by the Ground Jury of the Event.
- 2. Appeals to the Appeal Committee must be in writing, signed and accompanied by supporting evidence in writing on the prescribed forms and accompanied by the relevant deposit as set out in the Discipline General Regulations, and must be lodged not later than 1 hour after the decision of the Ground Jury.
- 3. No new evidence may be presented on appeal, other than in circumstances where it is shown that such new evidence could not have been obtained, with reasonable diligence, prior to the hearing before the first instance.
- 4. The decision of the Appeal Committee will be binding and final.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE

WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

DRESSAGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All classes will be run under the DSA Rules and those SAEF Rules applying to the Pony Rider South African Championships.
- 2. Entry Fees are as stated for each class. Dressage South Africa levies R17.10 and R4.50 EDTS
- 3. In the Pony Rider Individual Championships entries shall be restricted to the top qualified 15 competitors.
- 4. QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP. Two qualifying classes will be held as per DSA rule 37.3.3 which reads as follows: "qualifying competitions will be staged for the Championship event. The system for obtaining points in the two qualifying competitions shall be as follows:

Irrespective of the number of competitors in the competition the pony and rider placed first shall receive 20 points, the second 19 points and the third 18 points and so on. Ties shall be awarded full points. In the event of a tie of the total qualifying points for the 15th place, then all those for

this tying place shall be allowed to compete in the Championship. The pony and rider combination must be the same for the qualifying competitions and the Championship. Competitors are not compelled to enter or compete in both qualifying competitions, but must compete in at least one qualifier and one other class."

5. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any pony take part in the dressage classes if it has been schooled under saddle by anyone other than the competitor from the start of the first day of the show, **26 June 2015** until the last day of the show **5 July 2015**.
