#### **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. All SAEF classes will be run under the SAEF and Eventing South Africa rules updated 1 March 2015.
- 2. Sponsors, owners, riders, horses and ponies must be registered with SAEF, ESA and the Primary Club of choice in the Rider/Owners Geo-political area, for the 2014/2015 subscription year as at the closing date of entry. Entries out of order at closing date will be forfeited.
- 3. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 45.4.2 and 45.7.3, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country test. Surcingles are strongly recommended.
- 4. Competitors shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
- 5. Objections lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/B of the SAEF General Regulations and Section 43 of the Eventing Rules.
- 6. Registration of Horse/Pony and Rider with SAEF, ESA and your Club subscription fees must be paid by 1 January 2015
- 7. The organising committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a first come basis.
- 8. NO CHANGES BETWEEN CLASSES WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES.
- 9. Entries should be done online on the ESA Website <a href="www.eventingsa.co.za">www.eventingsa.co.za</a> Please use 187 with invoice number or surname as reference.
- 10. Any requests for a specific riding order MUST be clearly indicated on the entry form.
- 11. It is the responsibility of the Competitorsto make sure their entries have been received.
- 12. The most recently published dressage tests can be found on <a href="www.eventingsa.co.za">www.eventingsa.co.za</a> and FEI Test 2009 can be found on FEI Website <a href="www.fei.org">www.eventingsa.co.za</a>
- 13. The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing conditions at their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate. classes, riding times and competition days may be changed depending on the number of entries.
- 14. The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body, Eventing SA, SAEF, and Treverton Trust cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All Competitors and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk. Please note that Treverton Wildlife Area has Zebra and Buck on premises and maybe on the cross country course.
- 15. Ponies/horses may compete from the 1 August of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 4 years for Eventing 80 and below and 5 years for Eventing 90 and Eventing 100 classes.
- 16. The opening of the cross-country course signifies the start of the event and all eventing rules (including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery) will be enforced.
- 17. At the event venue and after the official opening of the course for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone other than the Competitors who will ride the horse in the competition to school a horse. All main arenas used in competition will be out of bounds.
- 18. As from the closing date of entries, no Competitors/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross-country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination.

- 19. Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the grounds without prior permission from the Chairman of the Organising Committee.
- 20. Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests. Bridle numbers are permitted for dressage phase only. Vest numbers to be worn for Showjumping and Cross Country Phase.
- 21. All entry forms must be signed.
- 22. Medical cards are compulsory and must be clearly visible on the rider, preferably on the arm.
- 23. No dressage test will be supplied so Competitors must ensure that they have the correct copies.
- 24. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
- 25. EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT.
- 26. All paddocks, lunge arenas, and arenas are STRICTLY out of bounds, with the exception of clearly demarcated competition arenas.
- 27. No dogs allowed in the Wildlife area of Treverton.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to Competitors or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise
