Rules and Regulations

- THE EVENT WILL BE RUN UNDER SAEF AND ESA rules updated 1 March 2015 (www.eventingsa.co.za)
- 2. As per Eventing Rules 45.4.2 and 45.7.3, protective headgear and body protectors are compulsory and surcingles are strongly recommended. Riders should have a Medical Card listing any allergies etc.
- 3. All tack must be checked before the beginning of the Cross Country.
- 4. All entries should be done online. www.eventingsa.co.za.
- 5. Entries for the Cross Country only costs R250 inclusive of Levies. These classes should be done on the entry form and faxed accompanied by a Proof of Payment which must clearly state Rider's Name as reference, or entries will not be accepted.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the Competitor to make sure their entries have been received.
- 7. NO DOGS ALLOWED
- 8. The Cross Country course will be open for inspection on foot from 2.00pm on Friday, 28th August 2015. This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all Eventing rules (including restrictions with regards to dress and saddlery) will be enforced. At the event venue and after the official opening of the courses for inspection for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone, other than the competitor who will ride the horse in the competition to school a horse. As from the closing date in the Schedule, no competitors/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination.
- 9. There will be Marshalls and Jump Judges out on the track to assist riders.
- Vehicles pulling 2 berth boxes can use the cattle grid entrance, but all large trucks to please
 use the side gate.
- 11. Due to limited vehicle access, we request that horse boxes be parked alongside drive paddock from where the horses can be walked or ridden to the warm up area. Once the Cross country is in progress no vehicle movement will be permitted except for Runners on Quad bikes and in case of emergencies when all horses and riders will be stopped. Limited Vehicle movement will be allowed during certain periods, when jump heights are altered as indicated on the proposed timetable.
- 12. All stallions must show a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or a yellow ribbon in the tail.
- 13. Generally more accidents occur in the warm up arena than on the course so All Riders must remember their manners.
- 14. Numbers are to be worn for all 3 Phases. Bridle Disc/numbers may be worn for Dressage and Jumping.
- 15. Dressage tests can be found on the Eventing website www.eventingsa.co.za
- 16. Ponies/Horses may compete from 1 August of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 4 years for Eventing 80 and below and 5 years for Eventing 90cm and Eventing 1m classes.

Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse

The Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those in International equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinate to competitive or commercial influences.

- At all stages of the preparation and training of competition horses. Welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten the welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling and fitness of the horse for onwards travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition is over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the Competition Horses
