Entry forms will be discarded if they are not accompanied by proof of payment. Please ensure your reference includes your initials and surname.

ENTRY FEES: As stated for each discipline, stabling. Entries are not refundable except when entries are withdrawn prior to closing date. All refunds will be subject to a 20% handling fee.

STABLING:

- R1350 for the duration of the show or R175.00 per night.
- Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase.
- The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Committee and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Stable Manager.
- Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.
- Stables will be allocated on a first come first paid basis.
- Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their entry form, however please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has entered early and you have entered late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first entered basis.
- NO temporary paddocks etc. may be erected anywhere on the show grounds.
- The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

PRIZE MONEY: A minimum of 60% of the total entry fee will be paid out to all open classes and a minimum of 40% will be paid out to provincial classes. This excludes any sponsorship money offered independently from the allocated prize money.



GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Applicable Rules:

The Event will be conducted under the Rules of Natural Justice as amplified by the Common Law, incorporating FEI General Rules and Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and the EADCM (Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication) Regulations for the duration of this Event or until further notice.

2. Membership:

All owners, riders & horses must be registered with their club and discipline and affiliated to SAEF or an FEI Group IX National Federation as at closing date of entries. All horses entered must have a SAEF Horse Passport or a Group IX passport.

3. Entry Fees:

Entry fees are clearly stated in the schedule for each Discipline.

4. Entries:

Entries close on Wednesday 18th November 2015 and will only be accepted if they have been received by the Secretary by that date.

5. Qualifying Age:

Competitors are classified as Junior Riders by each specific discipline's Rules and/or Directives.

6. Dress:

See various discipline' rules. No Provincial or sponsored shirts may be worn.

7. Treatment of Horses & Conduct of Riders:

As per the relevant discipline rules. Drug testing may be done at the discretion of the Discipline Executive 8. Equine Influenza and African Horse Sickness

The Abuse of Horses and use the of Prohibited substances, the Veterinary Regulations and the EADCM (Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations, {incorporating the Equine Prohibited Substances List} will apply.

All horses must have been vaccinated against Equine influenza according to SAEF regulations. Vaccinations are valid for six months and must be renewed prior to expiry; otherwise primary and secondary vaccinations will have to be re-administered. All horses travelling to the AHS surveillance area / Free zone must apply according to the SOP for entering into the Controlled area prior to the commencement of the return journey. A Permit must be issued by the State Veterinarian and be accompanied by a valid health certificate (in the passport) signed by a Private Veterinarian, not more than 48 hours prior to travelling. All horses must have been vaccinated by a VETERINARIAN against African Horse Sickness using a registered polyvalent African Horse Sickness vaccine as prescribed by the manufacturer and in accordance with SAEF Veterinary rules.

All horses must be in possession of and be accompanied by a SAEF or FEI Group IX passport, number to be included on the entry form. Details of all vaccinations must be entered in the passport. A random check of passports will be conducted to ensure that they comply. Competitors not complying with the above will be fined and may be refused entry onto the grounds. No entries will be accepted without the relevant AHS and flu vac details. No flu vaccination may be administered within 7 days of arriving at the show grounds.

9. Substitutions:

Application for substitutions must be made on the form provided at the secretary's office not later than 30 minutes before the commencement of the competition concerned or as per the discipline rules. The new rider must sign the substitution forms, indicating that he has the consent of the competitor originally entered.

NO BUYING & SELLING OF ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED.

12. Feed & Bedding:

Initial wood shavings bedding will be supplied, thereafter bedding can be purchased at the Show office. Food can be ordered from feed companies.

13. Grooms Facilities:

No grooms' accommodation available. Competitors are advised to provide their groom with suitable accommodation (tents etc.) Ablution facilities, with hot water, will be provided. Meals will be available for the duration of the show from Thursday 10th to Wednesday 15th December. The grooms will receive 3 meals per day including coffee and cool drinks the cost will be R250 per day.

No tents are allowed to be erected in the stable block perimeter.

14. Cancellation and combination of classes:

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, the organizing committee, in conjunction with the discipline Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes and restrict entries (other than those applicable to championships and their qualifying classes) to a practical number. Should cancelation occur, all the relevant classes will be refunded less 20% handling fee. Entry fees will be refunded for any entries not accepted.

15. Variation of programme:

The programme will be adhered to as far as possible. The organizing committee in conjunction with the discipline Representative reserves the right to make alterations in the event of insufficient or excessive entries, unfavourable weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

Competitor Obligations:

- Athletes are obliged to ride in all competitions for which they have qualified, unless they have been granted dispensation by the discipline Rep. This will normally only be given where a medical or veterinary certificate certifying that the rider or horse is unfit to compete, is produced for the competition concerned. - All athletes and horses are required to appear in parades when requested to do so.

- Prize-winners must be mounted when receiving their awards and both horse and rider must be properly dressed and turned out.

- No blankets may be worn in the competition arenas unless permission is given by the show convenors.

- Failure to co-operate and comply with these obligations may result in the forfeiting of all prize-money, rosettes, trophies and/or grading points for that competition arena, unless permission is given by the discipline Rep.

Exercising of horses:

At no time during the event may horses be exercised in the competition arenas. Only designated warm up arenas may be used.

Responsibility for damage, loss or injury:

The Sponsors, SAEF, KPC, SASJ, SAEQA, DSA, SASA, ESA and their officials shall in no way be responsible for any damage, loss or injury sustained by owners, competitors, members of the public or any other persons or their property whatsoever.

Dogs:

All dogs must be kept on hand held leads at all times on the show grounds. Failure to comply will incur an immediate R1000 spot fine.

Team Entries:

Notice by Provincial Bodies or FEI Group IX National Federations of their intention to participate in Team Championships must be sent to the Show Secretary, in writing with a copy to SAEF, by no later 18th November 2015. Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the Show Secretary (copy to SAEF) by 23th November 2015. Each Provincial Body or National Federation may only enter one team.

Team Managers must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 17:00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned.

The rules governing the substitution of team horses and/or riders are laid down in the relevant discipline rules. Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete in the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team.

This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Provincial Body.

PROTESTS

1. Protests may be lodged against any person or body involved in any capacity in the event subject to the jurisdiction of SAEF for failure to observe the Constitution, applicable Regulations or Rules or violation of the common principles of behaviour, fairness, or accepted standards of sportsmanship, whether occurring during and/or in connection with the event.

2. Any alleged contravention of the Rules relating to Prohibited Substances (horses and competitors) whether it occurs at a CI or CN Event or any other Event or at any other time shall be referred to the Judicial Committee for hearing, notwithstanding any Disciplines Rules and/or Regulations.

3. Protests may only be lodged by the Officials, Chefs d'Equipe or, if a Chef d'Equipe is not present, by a Person Responsible or a Team Veterinarian responsible for horses taking part in the event, with the exception of protests for abuse which may be lodged by any person or body.

4. Protests must be in writing, signed by the authorised person making the protest, and presented Personally to the President of the Ground jury, as the case may be, together with any supporting evidence, names of witnesses and the necessary deposit, during the duration of the Event.

5. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, protests against any of the following matters may only be lodged with the Ground Jury and within the following time limits, and a decision by the Ground Jury in these matters is a prerequisite to a right of appeal to the Appeal Committee.

5.1 Protests concerning the eligibility of a competitor or horse or to the conditions of the arena: not later than 30 minutes before the start of the relevant competition;

5.2 Protests concerning an obstacle, or the plan or length of the course for a jumping competition or the obstacle phase of a driving competition: not later than 15 minutes before the start of the competition;

5.3 Protests concerning the steeplechase or cross-country obstacles or courses in Eventing or marathon course or obstacle s in driving, or the course in Endurance not later than 18h00 on the day before the relevant competition;

5.4 Protests concerning irregularities or incidents during a competition, or the classification of a competition: not later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the results.

APPEALS: AS PER SAEF GENERAL REGULATIONS: 3.7.0 & 3.9.0

- 1. An Appeal may be lodged by any person with a legitimate interest against the decision(s) by the Ground Jury of the Event.
- 2. Appeals to the Appeal Committee must be in writing, signed and accompanied by supporting evidence in writing and must be lodged not later than 1 hour after the decision of the Ground Jury.
- 3. No new evidence may be presented on appeal, other than in circumstances where it is shown that such new evidence could not have been obtained, with reasonable diligence, prior to the hearing before the first instance.
- 4. The decision of the Appeal Committee will be binding and final.

CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF) expects all those involved in National Equestrian sport to adhere to and to acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the pony/horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition ponies/horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice pony/horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the pony/horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that ponies receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. SAEF urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
- 6. Any disciplinary process which might be instituted will be governed and ruled by the Common Law, incorporating the Rules of Natural Justice and any relevant Acts, Rules and/or Regulations.

DRESSAGE RULES

1. All classes will be run under the SA Dressage Rules (SA National Dressage Rules April 2012 – <u>www.dressagesa.com</u>), subject to any amendments published on the SA Dressage website subsequently, and those SA Dressage rules applying to the Junior South African Championships. In the event more than the required number of horses qualifies and a rider has qualified two or more horses, the rider must nominate one of their horses to ride.

2. RULE DSA 37.3.2

1. In the Junior Championships entries shall be restricted to the top qualified 15 competitors. If a rider qualifies more than one horse and there are more than 15 horses then the rider must nominate one of their horses for the Championship.

QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

- 1. Two qualifying classes will be held for the Championship Event. (See Rule 37.3.3)
- 2. The system for obtaining points in the two qualifying classes will be as follows:
- 3. Irrespective of the number of competitors in the competition the Horse and rider placed first shall receive 20 points, the second 19 points and the third 18 points and so on. Ties shall be awarded full points. In the event of a tie of the total qualifying points for the 15th place, then all those for this tying place shall be allowed to compete in the Championship. The horse and rider combination must be the same for the qualifying competitions and the Championship. Competitors are not compelled to enter or compete in both qualifying competitions, but must compete in at least one qualifier and one other class."
- 4. No horse may compete in more than two classes per day including freestyle.
- 5. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in the dressage classes if it has been Schooled under saddle by anyone other than the competitor from the start of the first day of the show 10 December 2015, until the last day of the Show 15th December 2015.

SASJ RULES FOR SA INDIVIDUAL AND SA TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

THE JUNIOR INDIVIDUAL SHOWJUMPING CHAMPIONSHIPS OF SOUTH AFRICA

1. COMPETITIONS RELATED TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP

There shall be three qualifying classes and one championship class for which competitors must qualify.

2. Qualifying competitions

The organising Committees shall include in the schedule the following competitions all of which shall be qualifying competitions. Prize money and other awards shall be awarded as for a Recognised Competition at the conclusion of each of these competitions.

2.1 First Qualifying Competition

This Competition shall be run in accordance with FEI Art 238.2.1 (A2 Competition). Speed 350mpm.

The course shall consist of between ten and twelve numbered fences and shall include only one double and one treble combination. If possible the course should include a water jump.

1.2 Second Qualifying Competition

This competition will be run in accordance with FEI Art 274.5.3. (Competition in Two Phases).

1.3 Third Qualifying Competition

This competition will be run in accordance with FEI Art 238.2.2 (AM5 Competition). Speed 350mpm.

The course shall consist of between ten and twelve numbered fences and shall include ONLY one double and ONE treble combination. If possible the course should include a water jump.

2. THE CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION

- 2.1 This competition shall be run over two rounds of a Championship course of national standard and in accordance with FEI Art 273.3.2. (SASJ Section 60)
- 2.2 The course will consist of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles and shall include either one double and one treble combination or three double combinations. If possible a water jump should be included in the course but may only be included if it was included in one of the qualifying competitions.
- 2.3 The dimensions of the fences in the course may be altered for the second round at the sole discretion of the Course Designer & PGJ.
- 2.4 The order of starting for the second round of the Championship shall be on the basis of reverse order of merit of the first round.
- 2.5 Should there be a jump-off then the order of riding in the jump-off shall be same as that of the second round.

3. NATIONAL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

3.1 Eligibility of Athletes

Athletes must have been normally resident within the Republic for a period of twelve consecutive months or more, immediately preceding the closing date for entries, and must have their principal place of residence in the Province which they are representing, as at the closing date of entries.

3.2 Intention To Compete

PEXCO's wishing to enter in National Team Championships shall notify the CEO and OC of the eventin writing of their intention to participate, before the closing date for entries.

Each PEXCO may only enter one team.

3.3 Nominations

PEXCOs shall submit details of their team, in writing, to the CEO and to the OC of the event, not later seven clear days before the first completion day of the event.

Horses and Athletes nominated in terms of this regulation must already have been entered for at least one individual class at the event before the closing date of entries.

The nominations shall state the first and last names of the athletes and the names of the horses together with the name of the Chef d' Equipe. Nominations will not be accepted unless the name of the Chefd'Equipe is included. The Chef d'Equipe shall ipso facto be the Team Captain.

The total number of nominations allowed is as follows:

Athletes 5 Horses 6

Team nominations for National Team Championships shall be certified by the PEXCO of the Province concerned as being correct and in accordance with the rules.

3.4 Final Selection

The final selection of the Team shall be submitted by the Chef d'Equipe to the OC of the event and to the Technical Delegate by no later than 17h00, or such other time as the Technical Delegate may determine, on the day immediately prior to the Competition.

The Technical Delegate shall then, in the presence of the Chefs d'Equipe and the OC draw the order of starting of the teams.

The selected team shall be chosen from those Athletes and horses nominated in terms of???

The following details shall be submitted together with the Final Selection.

Selected Horse and Athlete combination (4) Reserve Athlete (1) Reserve Horses (2) Order of riding of horses

Should a team at the time of selection only be able to produce three Horses and Athlete combinations, then that team shall compete with only three Horse and Athlete combinations.

Reserves

The Athlete and Horses nominated , but not included in the final selection are ipso facto the reserves

3.5 Team Substitutions

Before Final Selection

No substitution of Horses or Athletes for those nominated is permitted within the seven days prior to the first competition day of the event. It is the duty of PEXCOs to ensure that they nominate sufficient horses and athletes so that should any nominee be unable to compete for any reason, they will still be able to field a team.

After Final Selection

If any athletes or horses included in the final selection are unable to compete by reason of injury, illness or death of an athlete or horse occurring after the final selections, and as certified by a medical or veterinary certificate, the Chef d'Equipe may substitute an athlete, a horse or horse and athlete combination, only from the reserves. This needs to be done 30 minutes before the start of the class.

The Chef d'Equipe may change the Athlete on any of the horses selected for another Athlete provided both Athletes were included in the final selection (excluding reserves). In this case no medical certificate is required.

Notice of this substitution shall be given in writing to the Technical Delegate and to the OC before the commencement of the first round of the championship concerned and shall be accompanied by the relevant medical or veterinary certified, if required.

Under no circumstances may the order of riding of the horses within their teams be changed.

3.6 Combined Teams

Should any two or more PEXCOs be unable to compete in a National Team Championship due to the lack of Athletes/horses of the required standard, then they may combine to send one team. This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a PEXCO.

3.7 FEI Art 273 – 2 Round Competition Rule

This competition shall be run over two rounds of a Championship course of national standard and in accordance with FEI Art 273.3.2 (SASJ Section 60) Speed 350mpm.

The course will consist of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles and shall include either one double and one treble combination or three double combinations. If possible a water jump should be included in the course but may only be included if it was included in one of the qualifying competitions.

The dimensions of the fences in the course may be altered for the second round at the sole discretion of the Course Designer and President of the Ground Jury.

The order of starting for the second round of the Championship shall be on the basis of reverse order of merit of the first round.

Should there be a jump-off then the order of riding in the jump-off shall be the same as that of the second round.

SHOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All classes will be run under SASA Showing Rules- 16th Edition (Revised July 2015)
- 2. Heights of Horses must be stated on entry forms and in Horses passport.
- 3. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.

QUALIFICATION OF HORSES – 59.3.1 In the Ault/Junior/Pony National Showing Team Championship, horses must be qualified by having been placed and received points, in at least one recognised show within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes as per rule 59.1.4. Being placed in a Novice Class may be considered as being qualified to compete at this level.

The reserve horse that may be chosen, has to have been placed, with points, in at least one recognised show in at least one of the five classes (as per 59.1.4) in order for the horse to be eligible to be chosen as a reserve for the team.

- 4. No cross entry of horse/rider combinations in the SA Team Championship and the Challenge Team Championship. A rider may compete in both, but on different horses.
- 5. In the Challenge Team Event it is preferable that horses have at least competed in a recognised showing class within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes as per Rule 61.4. The Challenge team Event is open to both Novice and Open horses/ponies.

59.2.1 All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website <u>www.showingsa.co.za</u> or from <u>admin@showingsa.co.za</u>

- 6. Horses shall be registered with SAEF and SASA
- 7. The horse and rider combination will compete as a member of the Province where the rider is resident.
- 8. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in any of the showing classes if the horse has been ridden by anyone other than the competitor from the first day of the show.
- 9. A deposit of R20 for a number is included in the entry fee. This is refundable to all competitors on condition that the number is returned before the end of the show. Entry fees are not refundable.
- 10. Horses entered in the Inter Provincial team event have to be entered in either the Open or Novice classes
- 11. Horses entered in the Challenge team event have to be entered into either the open or novice classes.
- 12. **Membership** All Owners and athletes entering the National (CN) classes must be registered with a Club, SAEF and have registered as a Showing member.
- 13. Horses entering the National (CN) classes must be registered with SAEF.
