CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.





Rules and Regulations

- All classes will be run under SAEF and ESA Eventing Rules March 2015.
- 2. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 45.4.2 and 45.7.3, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country test. Surcingles are strongly recommended.
- 3. Competitors shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
- 4. Protests lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/B of the SAEA General Regulations and Section 43 of the Eventing Rules.
- 5. Registration of Horse/Pony and Rider with SAEF and ESA, and Club membership must be up to date as at 1 August 2014 for all Classes. The Organising Committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a
- 6. Faxed entries will only be accepted if accompanied by a stamped deposit slip, which should clearly state Rider's Name as reference. Proof of payment must be supplied if entry fees are paid via electronic funds transfer - use Rider's Name& initial as reference.
- 7. Any requests for a specific riding order MUST be clearly indicated on the entry form. It is the responsibility of the competitor to make sure their entries have been received. The dressage tests used are from the Eventing Dressage Tests available on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za.
- The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing conditions at 8. their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate.
- The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body(DMRC), ESA, SAEF and Dolcoed Equestrian Centre cannot 9. be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All competitors and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk.
- 10. Ponies/horses may compete from the 1 August of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 4 years for Eventing 80 and below and 5 years for Eventing 90m and Eventing 100m classes.
- 11. The Cross Country courses will be open for inspection on foot from 14h00 the day prior to the commencement of the dressage. This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all eventing rules (including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery) will be enforced. At the event venue and after the official opening of the courses for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone other than the competitor who will ride the horse in the competition to school a horse.
- As from 2nd May, no competitor/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross country obstacles, until 12. called upon to do so under penalty of elimination.
- 13. Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the grounds without prior permission from the Event Director.
- 14. Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests. Bridle numbers are permitted.
- 15. MEDICAL INFORMATION Revised Rule. See Rule 45.7.3 – Medical armbands or ICE bands must be worn.
- Sponsors, owners, riders, horses and ponies must be registered with SAEF, ESA and the Primary Club of 16. choice in the Riders/Owners Geo-Political area, for the 2016 subscription year as at the closing date of entry. Entries out of order at closing date will be forfeited.
- Parking in designated areas only. NO Dogs are allowed under any circumstance. Anyone bringing a dog onto 17. the property will be asked to leave immediately.
- A complete list of SAEF General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations, Eventing Rules and Eventing Dressage 18. Tests can be found on www.eventingsa.co.za No dressage test will be supplied so competitors must ensure that they have the correct copies.
- 19. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
- 20. EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT. AHS VACCINATIONS MUST BE IN ORDER.

A QR for Eventing 90 and Eventing 100 is completion of the event without incurring jumping penalties in the Cross Country Test.

A QR for CIC/CNC (Short format) competitions is completion of an event with not more than 75 penalties in the Dressage test; plus 0 penalties at obstacles and not exceeding the optimum time by more than 90 seconds in the Cross Country test; plus not more than 16 penalties at obstacles in the Showjumping Test.

A QR for CCI/CCN (Long format) competitions is completion of an event with not more than 75 penalties in the Dressage test; plus 20 penalties at obstacles and not exceeding the optimum time by more than 90 seconds in the Cross Country test; plus not more than 16 penalties at obstacles in the Showjumping Test.
