SHOW ENTRY FEE INSURANCE

Navarre Equestrian Centre offers entry fee insurance coverage. If a rider or horse cannot compete at the show due to medical reasons and a doctor/vet certificate is presented the entry fees paid (less levies) by the rider will be refunded. A farrier report may also be submitted in the event of a horse being lame. The cost of the entry fee insurance is 10% of your entry fee. Please email madelie@apexstationers.co.za should you require more details or to obtain this insurance.

POPIA Compliance

Please note that by law we are required to keep an attendance register for every day of every show we host and collect COVID forms for every person entering the show venue. This does include personal information.

The attendance register is scanned and emailed to the South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF) after the show. The attendance registers and the completed forms are then placed into a sealed envelope and stored for the 6 months required by law. These will only be used in the event of having to trace all show attendees. After six months the registers and forms are destroyed by shredding.

Navarre Equestrian Centre and Wild Coast Eventing will endeavour to ensure that all information is always kept secure and will not share this information with anyone other than SAEF. We take this matter seriously and can assure you that we have taken the necessary precautions to ensure the safety of your personal information.

COVID19 –Rules and Regulations

Please familiarise yourself and anyone accompanying you to the show with the SAEF guidelines and the Government gazette rules to be adhered to at the show. We will have a compliance officer overseeing the show – if you are asked to follow any regulation or guideline by the Officer please comply; it is for your own safety and the safety of the officials and your fellow riders.

Once entries are in, we will organise the schedule to minimize interaction and reduce the chance of social interaction. Please take responsibility for yourselves and comply with any direction by show officials. Hand sanitisers will be available but please also bring your own and provide for your groom.

This show will be run under COVID 19 restrictions as gazette by the Government and SAEF guidelines in force at this time. All persons entering the venue agree to comply with all SA Government, Minister of Sports and SAEF COVID 19 lockdown regulations.

By submitting your entry, you agree to comply with all such regulations.

The SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Safe Sport Resumption Document pertains to all entrants, namely;

- All riders, officials, staff, support staff and medics agree and confirm to comply with the SA Government and SAEF Covid-19 guidelines and protocols as set out on the SAEF website www.saeef.org.za when entering a show/event.
- All attendees will be obliged to report to the COVID 19 Officer/employee, upon entry of the premises to sign the register, sanitise their hands, and have their temperature taken and recorded. The name of the Compliance Officer will be indicated on the schedule
- Riders may be accompanied by a maximum of two attendees (driver and groom).
- Where the rider is a minor (under the age of 18) an addition attendee (parent) may accompany the rider.
- All attendees are required to complete a self-assessment COVID questionnaire and complete the attendance register daily.
- **Spectators** will be allowed access to the venue but will be required to sign the attendance register, complete a self-assessment COVID questionnaire **and produce a valid COVID Vaccination Certificate.**
- Riders are required to minimize the amount of time spent at the venue. Please only be on site if you are attending to the needs of your horse or riding in the competition. No socialising, congregating, spectating or gathering will be permitted
- Any person who suspects that they have been in contact with an infected person is asked to not attend the event.
- Social distancing will be required throughout the Event/Show - 2 m for individuals, as well as for riders on horseback.
- All riders will always be required to wear a mask, except when mounted.
- All other Individuals are to WEAR A FACE MASK whilst on the premises and to ensure they bring their own masks. (Riders to ensure their grooms/accompanying persons are compliant)
- All entries will be done online, and no changes or additions will be made on the day.

- Individual time slots will be allocated on close of entries with specific durations determined by the various disciplines per horse and rider combination. Times will be available 48 hours before the event and available on the ESA website and/or the Navarre FB page.
- Sanitization stations and rules to be applied.
- There will be no traditional prize giving ceremony allowed, prize money by EFT- at the discretion of the show holder. Results will be posted online or provided by email. The following relaxation may be implemented at shows or rides
 - a) Podium may only be used if 1st, 2nd and 3rd place 'boxes' are placed 2m apart
 - b) Riders may be handed their winning day sheet outside the arena and then a lap of honour is allowed for the first 3 horses.
 - c) Rosettes may be placed in a designated area clearly marked for the riders' attention.
 - d) Dressage tests may be placed in a designated area clearly mark for the rider's attention.
 - e) Riders are cautioned to wear masks and adhere to strict social distancing guidelines.
 - f) The designated area must be provided with hand sanitiser for recipients to use.
 - g) Riders are also requested not to gather at the collection point.
- Designated parking areas and Horse box parking slots will be marked out in accordance with social distancing regulations (min. of 5m between each Horse Box).
- Riders are required to ensure their transport and equipment is sanitized before and after each event.
- Should stabling be used - stable spaces between yards (no less than 1 stable in between) as well as Stable blocks to be allocated with social distancing guidelines in place.
- Stables for visiting horses if absolutely necessary need to be situated far from the competition arena where horses and grooms will be isolated from the other competitors.
- Athletes are to provide their grooms with disposable gloves to be used when filling water buckets and using the wash bays.
- Arenas to have separate IN and OUT Gates.
- Although the Show Holding Body has taken all necessary precautions to ensure compliance to Covid-19 protocols and guidelines as stipulated by the Department of Health, it is important to note that neither the Show holding Body, nor SAEF can be held responsible for any person contracting COVID-19 at the said venue. All attendees are entering the venue at their own risk
- There will be no refunds for show entries. Should any attendee at the show contravene any of the Covid-19 regulations, then he/she will be asked by the Covid-19 Compliance Officer to leave the venue immediately. There will be no refunds for show entries
- Riders may warm-up and compete without a mask
- Catering will be available under extremely strict COVID-19 protocols

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horse's welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
6. Athletes, Members and all Affiliates to Eventing SA must ensure that they have read and understand the Social Media Policy which can be found on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za under Documents/Eventing Rules.

General Rules and Regulations

1. All classes will be run under SAEF and ESA Eventing Rules as at 1 January 2021, FEI Eventing Rules 25th edition effective 1 January 2022 and in compliance of the SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Resumption document. Any rider, or their entourage, who breaches these conditions will be disqualified and asked to leave the venue, without recourse.
2. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 05.4.2 and 05.7.2, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country Surcingle and strongly recommended.
3. Competitors shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
4. Protests lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/D of the SAEF General Regulations and Section 03 of the Eventing Rules.
5. Registration of Rider with SAEF and ESA, and Club membership must be up to date as at 1 January 2022 for all Classes. The Organising Committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a first entered and paid basis.
6. Entries should be done online on the ESA Website: www.eventingsa.co.za. Please use the Rider's name & entry invoice number as reference.
7. Any requests for a specific riding order **MUST** be emailed to the SHB. It is the responsibility of the competitor to make sure their entries have been received. The dressage tests used are from the 2020/2021 DSA Dressage Tests and are available on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za and FEI Tests updated 2021 which can be found on the FEI website www.fei.org, or ESA Website.
8. The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing Conditions, at their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate.

9. The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body, ESA, SAEF, FEI and Navarre Equestrian Centre cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All competitors and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk.
10. The Cross-Country courses will be open for inspection on foot from **12h00** on **18th February 2022**. This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all Eventing rules including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery will be enforced. At the event venue and after the official opening of the courses for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone, other than the competitor who will ride the horse in the competition, to school a horse. Only the rider allowed on the field of play.
11. **As from the 11th February 2022, no competitor/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross-country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination.**
12. **Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the grounds without prior permission from the Chairman of the Organising Committee.**
13. **Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests.** Bridle numbers are permitted for the Dressage and Show Jumping phases.
14. **Competitors please note that Medical Cards/other forms of medical tags are compulsory for the Cross – Country phase and medical details MUST also be updated on the Eventing SA Website. Please inform the organising committee &/or the medics when you arrive, if you have had any major accident recently involving concussion. It is the responsibility of the rider, or parent/guardian to give this information to the medics.**
15. Sponsors, owners, riders, horses and ponies must be registered with SAEF, ESA and the Primary Club of choice in the Riders/Owners Geo-Political area, for the 2022 subscription year as at the closing date of entry. Entries out of order at closing date will be forfeited.
16. Parking in designated areas only.
17. **Dogs must be on Leads (there will be a FINE of R50 for unleashed dogs).**
18. A complete list of SAEF General Regulations, SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Document, Veterinary Regulations, Eventing Rules and Eventing Dressage Tests can be found on the www.eventingsa.co.za. No dressage test will be supplied so competitors must ensure that they have the correct copies.
19. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
20. **EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS + 21 days OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT. No horse may compete in the 7 days after the vaccination. AHS VACCINATIONS MUST BE IN ORDER.**
21. Should the show be cancelled for any reason only 50% of entry fees will be refunded. No entry fees will be refunded if the show is postponed.
22. All horses/ponies that are prone to kicking must wear a red ribbon in their tails.
23. All stallions entered into the show remain the responsibility of the owner and rider at all times. The stallion is expected to be kept secure at all times, with no access to any other horse. A yellow ribbon must be worn on the bridle at all times
24. No fires are allowed anywhere on the premises
25. Whilst Navarre Equestrian Centre will endeavor to ensure that the perimeter gates are kept closed at all times Navarre Equestrian Centre cannot accept any responsibility for any gates left open by any person. Riders are to ensure that their horses are securely kept at all times.
