*Combined Teams – should any two or three Provinces be unable to compete in a National Team Championship due to the lack of competitors/ horses of the required standard, then, two or three of those Provinces may combine to send one team. This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a Team entered by a Province. Team members will be awarded Provincial Colours according to the policy of their provincial federation.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horse's welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
- 6. Athletes, Members and all Affiliates to Eventing SA must ensure that they have read and understand the Social Media Policy, which can be found on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za under Documents/Eventing Rules.

Rules and Regulations







- 1. All classes will be run under SAEF and ESA Eventing Rules as at 1 January 2021, FEI Eventing Rules 25th edition effective 1 January 2022 and in compliance of the SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Resumption document. Any rider, or their entourage, who breaches these conditions will be disqualified and asked to leave the venue, without recourse.
- 2. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 05.4.2 and 05.7.2, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country Surcingles are strongly recommended.
- 3. Competitors shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
- 4. Protests lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/D of the SAEF General Regulations and Section 03 of the Eventing Rules.
- 5. Registration of Rider with SAEF and ESA, and Club membership must be up to date as at 1 January 2022 for all Classes. The Organising Committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a first entered and paid basis. Entries for competitors nominated to represent provincial or federation teams will be must be completed by the closing date, but will not be subject to the first entered restriction.
- 6. Entries should be done online on the ESA Website: www.eventingsa.co.za. Please use the Rider's name & your invoice number as reference.
- 7. Any requests for a specific riding order **MUST** be emailed to the SHB. It is the responsibility of the competitor to make sure their entries have been received. The dressage tests are available on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za and FEI Tests can be found on the FEI website www.eventingsa.co.za and FEI Tests can be found on the FEI website www.eventingsa.co.za and FEI Tests can be found on the FEI website.
- 8. The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing Conditions, at their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate.
- 9. The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body, ESA, SAEF, FEI and the Fourways Riding Centre & NFEP cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All competitors and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk.
- 10. The Cross-Country courses will be open for inspection on foot from 12:00 on Friday 1 July 2022. This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all Eventing rules including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery will be enforced. At the event venue and after the official opening of the courses for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone, other than the competitor who will ride the horse in the competition, to school a horse. Only the rider allowed on the field of play.
- 11. As from the 20th June 2022 in the Schedule, no competitor/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross-country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination, provided that horses and ponies and their riders in the unaffiliated classes will be allowed to walk their courses mounted at a time that will be published in the programme.
- 12. Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the grounds without prior permission from the Chairman of the Organising Committee.
- 13. **Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests.** Bridle numbers are permitted for the Dressage and Show Jumping phases.
- 14. Competitors please note that Medical Cards/other forms of medical tags are compulsory for the Cross Country phase and medical details MUST also be updated on the Eventing SA Website. Please inform the organising committee &/or the medics when you arrive, if you have had any major accident recently involving concussion. It is the responsibility of the rider, or parent/guardian to give this information to the medics.
- 15. Sponsors, owners, riders, horses and ponies must be registered with SAEF, ESA and the Primary Club of choice in the Riders/Owners Geo-Political area, for the 2022 subscription year as at the closing date of entry. Entries out of order at closing date will be forfeited.
- 16. Parking in designated areas only. NO Dogs are permitted on NFEP grounds as they are within a registered Nature reserve. We appeal to eventers, including those who brought their dogs to the previous show







not to put the future of the equestrian facilities at risk by bringing their dogs. (A fine of R500 will be issued)

- 17. A complete list of SAEF General Regulations, SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Document, Veterinary Regulations, Eventing Rules and Eventing Dressage Tests can be found on the www.eventingsa.co.za. No dressage test will be supplied so competitors must ensure that they have the correct copies.
- 18. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
- 19. EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS + 21 days OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT. No horse may compete in the 7 days after the vaccination. AHS VACCINATIONS MUST BE IN ORDER.
- 20. Comply fully with Covid-19 regulations as laid down by SAEF/National Government as gazette.
