CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. *At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horse's welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.*
2. *Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.*
3. *Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.*
4. *Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.*
5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*
6. *Athletes, Members and all Affiliates to Eventing SA must ensure that they have read and understand the Social Media Policy, which can be found on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za under Documents/Eventing Rules.*

Rules and Regulations

IF YOU WANT TO BE CONSIDERED IN THE TEAM FOR INTERDISTRICTS PLEASE COMPLETE THE CAPABILITY FORM ATTACHED AND RETURN TO sdridingclub@gmail.com BEFORE 30 AUGUST 2023. [SEP]

1. All classes will be run under SAEF and ESA Eventing Rules as at 1 March 2023, FEI Eventing Rules 25th edition effective 1 January 2023 and in compliance of the SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Resumption document. Any rider, or their entourage, who breaches these conditions will be disqualified and asked to leave the venue, without recourse.
2. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 538.11 and 523.1, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country
3. Competitors shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
4. Protests lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/D of the SAEF General Regulations and Section 03 of the Eventing Rules.
5. Registration of Rider with SAEF and ESA, and Club membership must be up to date as at 1 January 2023 for all Classes. The Organising Committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a first entered and paid basis.
6. Entries should be done online on the ESA Website: www.eventingsa.co.za. Please use the Rider's name & your invoice number as reference.

7. Any requests for a specific riding order **MUST** be emailed to the SHB. It is the responsibility of the competitor to make sure their entries have been received. The dressage tests are available on the ESA website www.eventingsa.co.za and FEI Tests can be found on the FEI website www.fei.org, or ESA Website.
8. The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing Conditions, at their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate.
9. The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body, ESA, SAEF, FEI and the **STELLENBOSCH DISTRICT RIDING CLUB** cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All competitors and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk.
10. The Cross-Country courses will be open for inspection on foot from 12H00 ON 8TH SEPTEMBER 2023 This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all Eventing rules including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery will be enforced. At the event venue and after the official opening of the courses for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone, other than the competitor who will ride the horse in the competition, to school a horse. Only the rider allowed on the field of play.
11. **As from the 2nd SEPTEMBER 2023 in the Schedule, no competitor/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross-country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination.**
12. **Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the grounds without prior permission from the Chairman of the Organising Committee.**
13. **Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests.** Bridle numbers are permitted for the Dressage and Show Jumping phases.
14. **Competitors please note that Medical Cards/other forms of medical tags are compulsory for the Cross – Country phase and medical details MUST also be updated on the Eventing SA Website. Please inform the organising committee &/or the medics when you arrive, if you have had any major accident recently involving concussion. It is the responsibility of the rider, or parent/guardian to give this information to the medics.**
15. Sponsors, owners, riders, horses and ponies must be registered with SAEF, ESA and the Primary Club of choice in the Riders/Owners Geo-Political area, for the 2023 subscription year as at the closing date of entry. Entries out of order at closing date will be forfeited.
16. Parking in designated areas only. **Dogs must be on Leads (there will be a FINE of R50 for unleashed dogs)**
17. A complete list of SAEF General Regulations, SAEF Equestrian Sport Ready Document, Veterinary Regulations, Eventing Rules and Eventing Dressage Tests can be found on the www.eventingsa.co.za. No dressage test will be supplied so competitors must ensure that they have the correct copies.
18. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
19. **EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS + 21 days OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT.**
No horse may compete in the 7 days after the vaccination. AHS VACCINATIONS MUST BE IN ORDER.

INTERDISTRICT TEAM SELECTION AND CAPABILITY FORM

INTER DISTRICT TEAM SELECTION CRITERIA & COMPETITION RULES - EVENTING

It is an honour and privilege to be selected for a District Team, and riders chosen will be expected to participate in ALL team functions including training sessions, cocktail parties, parades, or anything that the Chef d'Equipe deems necessary. Once the team has been finalized, the Chef de Equipe has the final say over all team riders and the selection of the final 4 and reserve.

Good sportsmanship is expected at all times as well as courtesy shown to fellow team members and opposition teams. If a rider and horse combination accept their Team selection, they are expected to treat it as their first priority over any other shows/classes that they may wish to compete in.

OBJECTIVE

To select a Team of "on form" combinations as at the time of the show. Performance of all relevant combinations will be monitored prior to selection.

RECORDS

A performance record will be looked at and will include the following: -

1. Size and type of Class
2. Placing
3. Clear Rounds
4. Type of Faults (poles or stops)
5. Recurring Problems (water, napping etc)

SHORT LIST

After applying the above and analyzing the records, a list of riders will be identified for final selection. This list is purely objective and self-selective.

FINAL SELECTION

Should a team of riders not be obvious after the above process, the following will be considered.

- Length of partnership of horse and rider
- Experience of Rider
- Soundness of horse. (Random veterinary inspections may be conducted from time to time, inclusive of dope testing)
- Any disciplinary action or letter of warning that may have been issued to the rider.

SELECTORS DECISION

If, after all the above, there is a decision to be made between two riders, authority is given to the Selection Committee to choose who they deem to be the best at that time. THIS DECISION WILL BE FINAL. It may be based on rider temperament, by vote, if in a previous team - the commitment and team spirit shown, however it is made, it will be subjective.

TEAMS

Open level teams will be:

- •Junior and Adult 2*
 - •Junior and Adult 1*
 - •Pony Rider 95
 - •Should there not be enough numbers to warrant a 95cm Pony Rider team competition, then one 85cm team from each District will qualify for Open colours.
- Junior and Adult combined teams will be allowed.

JUDGING OF THE COMPETITION

○ The team competition will run concurrently with the relevant Eventing competition class

SCORING

- The top 3 individual team rider penalties will be combined for a final result. The team with the lowest number of combined penalties shall be deemed the winning team.
- In the event of a Team tie, the classification will be decided by adding the numbers of the highest 3 placings (not scores) with the team with the lowest score being deemed the winning team. i.e. a team with riders placed individually 2nd, 8th and 12th will have a team total of 22 and will beat that of a team with riders placed individually 1st, 7th and 15th for a total of 23. Should these figures still remain tied, then a tie shall be declared.
- In the event of a team competitor being eliminated, retiring or withdrawing for any reason, a total of 1000 penalties will be awarded to that combination for the team competition.
